Operation Christmas Child Pack & Pray



It happened a number of years ago while I was standing in the outfield tossing pop-ups to three six year olds. I was trying everything I knew to get them to hold on to a fly ball. "Here we go, Chris. Hold your glove up this way. Move to the ball. Get it in the glove, then trap it with your free hand so you can dig it out and be ready to throw." These were my instructions over and over again.

Then I said, "Okay, now we're going to try something new. I'm going to toss it up anywhere. One of you call for it, saying, 'I got it' and make the catch." Little Doug just stood there with this puzzled look. Then he blurted out, "Coach Webner, shouldn't it be I have it?" Baseball players have been yelling "I got it" for over a hundred years. Little Doug has never caught a ball in his life, but could he be right about this? I quickly mulled it over in my head, "I got it. I have it. I got it." "Your right, Doug," I said. Technically, it

should be 'I have it,' but it comes out quicker to say 'I got it.'"

I kept it the same, but Doug made me think about what I was doing. I've appreciated that thought-provoking moment ever since. We shouldn't just do things the same old way just because we've always done them that way before. We need to be secure enough in who we are as Christians so that we can occasionally risk changing some of our old ways.

Change isn't always the answer, but change for the better is what Christ wants from us. When somebody has a new idea, it should be considered. Jesus brought a whole new way of living to the people of his day. Nicodemus, the Pharisee, learned all about that when he was confronted with being born again.

The prophet Jeremiah warned his people to "re-form" their ways so that God would give them life. This same word of caution still applies to us today. Whether God's word comes from a six year old little leaguer or a thirty-something year old Jesus we'd better be willing to listen and change accordingly.


